

Welcome to Prague! Whether you've just landed with plane, arrived by train, bus or car, we have very important information about how to get to the city centre using all possible types of transport, without wasting more money than it's necessary.

↓1. PRAGUE BY PLANE

The airport is located on the northwest edge of Prague, about 20 kilometres (12 miles) from the centre of the metropolis. Your money can be changed in the currency exchange offices or kiosks situated in the airport. Important phone numbers include +420 220 111 888 (General info line - nonstop operation) and +420 220 115 005 (Lost and Found service).

HOW TO GET TO THE CITY CENTER

If you've just arrived at the airport, getting to the centre will take about twenty to thirty minutes depending on traffic (if you use a taxi or shuttle service you will find necessary information below). If you choose cheaper but less convenient public transport you have to expect fifty minutes on the road.

↓...BY PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

The bus is the cheapest way to get to the city centre. The disadvantage may be that you need to buy a bus ticket paid in Czech crowns or with credit card. To get the cash, you can use ATMs in the arrival halls of the airport. Or you can buy the actual ticket directly in a kiosk or at the information. counter in both arrival halls (open from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.). Furthermore, in the vending machines, located next to the bus stop, or directly from the bus driver (it will cost you a few crowns more). The ticket price is 32 CZK for a transfer ticket, with which you can freely switch among bus, tram and subway for 90 minutes. On the shorter distance and duration of 30 minutes you can use the ticket for 24 CZK (with this ticket, however, it is not allowed to switch among the types of transport). If you have more luggages, you will pay 16 Czech crowns extra.

BUS # 119

This is the most likely choice for most people because the BUS # 119 provides the fastest connec-

tion to the historic city centre. Depending on the time of day, the bus runs every 7-20 minutes and gets you to subway line A. After boarding remember to "click" the ticket. Get off at the station Veleslavín (journey from the airport to the subway takes about 15 minutes). Subway entrance is located few steps from the bus stop. The bus runs from 4:23 a.m. until 11:45 p.m. at night.

BUS # 100

BUS # 100 connects the airport with the subway line B, get off at the final stop, which is called Zličín. BUS # 100 runs every 15 minutes throughout the day and every 30 minutes after 7 p.m. The ride takes about 18 minutes, but expect another 20-minute subway ride, if your goal is to get to the city centre (Zličín is the final stop of subway line B). Bus runs 5:41 a.m. to 11:36 p.m. hours.

AIRPORT EXPRESS BUS

Airport Express Bus service connects the airport with the Prague's Main Railway Station and runs every 30 minutes and the journey takes about 35 minutes. You can use the Prague public transport fares or special fares: Tickets for AE can be bought only from the driver for 60 crowns (no additional charge for luggage). AE runs 5:30 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.

TRAVELLING AT NIGHT


If you have to use public transport at night, the best option is the BUS # 510, which runs between midnight and 3:26 a.m. and connects the air-port with stop at Divoká Šárka. Afterwards take the TRAM # 51 which will go to the city centre. Night BUS # 510 runs every 30 minutes.

J...BY TAXI

Companies of Taxi Praha and FIX are managing the taxi service from the Václay Havel Airport, Customers can enjoy free Wi-Fi, ensured availability of cars within 5 minutes of interest order in 24 hours a day, maximally 3-years old cars, advanced language skills of drivers, friendly demeanour, maintaining cleanliness and representative wear of vehicle drivers. Labelled taxis are waiting at the Václav Havel airport in two places - at Terminal 1 at the parking lot P1 EXPRESS and at Terminal 2 at the parking lot P2 EXPRESS - departures. Prices are not burdened with airport charges and therefore are considerably lower, while maintaining a high comfort of vehicles. One-time departure rate is 40 CZK and 1 km will cost 23.90 CZK (order taxi through dispatch call 14 014, +420 222 333 222, 729 331 133).

2. GETTING TO PRAGUE BY TRAIN

International trains stop at the central train station - Prague Main Railway Station. The station is directly connected to the subway station (line C), and is just a few steps away from the city centre, from Wenceslas Square. If you drive here after dark, we recommend you to go to Wenceslas Square subway (do not forget to buy a ticket). Most of the station is renovated and offers a modern look with plenty of stalls, shops and fast-food restaurants.



3. ARRIVAL BY BUS

Florenc is the central bus station. Located in the heart of the city and directly adjacent to the subway station Florenc (it is a transfer station between subway lines B and C). As well as the main train station, Florenc underwent a costly renovation and now boasts with very pleasant and clean halls for arrival and departure, kiosks and fast food restaurants (Burger King, etc.). And most importantly, there are a large digital boards showing departure / arrivals times of buses and associated boarding platform.

4. ARRIVAL BY CAR

Prague, like most European cities, suffers from very heavy traffic and lack of freely available parking spaces (the street with blue coloured areas are reserved for residents and you risk stripping off your car when you park there). That is why we recommend the use so-called P + R (Park and Ride) parking lot, located close to all major highways. More info on www.dpp.cz/en/parking.

5. SUBWAY

The Prague subway consists of three lines - A (green), B (yellow) and C (red). Subway in Prague is designed so that it gets you to all historically and logistically important locations (or at least near). Subway is clear and many stations recently underwent large renovations.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Prague's public transport system is generally clear, efficient, time

accurate and its network covers the whole city. Price 32 CZK for a transfer ticket is very reasonable.

Tickets for public transport can be purchased at many vending machines at all metro stations and many tram stops (paid with coins or with a credit card), or in most tobacco shops / kiosks. You can also use the SMS ticket. Send a message on 902 06 and receive a return SMS with a valid ticket.

Do not forget to mark the ticket at the first entrance to the subway / boarding the tram or bus. (le. Insert a ticket into one of the yellow boxes and have it printed with date and time)

For over 1000 years. Prague has served as the political, cultural and economic centre of the Czech state. Having been the seat of two Holy Roman Emperors during the gothic and renaissance periods, it also had the status of the Holy Roman Empire capital. Prague's history commenced in the year 870, although evidence shows the area had been inhabited since the Stone Age. The city flourished during the 14th century, under the reign of King Charles IV, who, among other deeds, ordered the building of the famous Charles Bridge or Saint Vitus Cathedral, the oldest gothic cathedral in central Europe, and Charles University, the oldest university in central Europe. Prague was then the third-largest city in Europe. Now home to some 1.2 million inhabitants. Prague became the capital of the newly set up Czechoslovakia in 1918. with the end of WW I and the dissolution of the Austro-Hungarian Empire. In 1992, Prague's historic center became a UNESCO world heritage site. and is currently one of the world's most popular tourist destinations.

PRAŠNÁ BRÁNA

PRAGUE 1. NÁMĚSTÍ REPUBLIKY 5

The Powder Gate (Prašná brána) is a late-Gothic structure and one of the most important monuments of medieval Prague. It was here that the Royal Route began and where one of the main roads from Kutná Hora. where silver was mined into the royal treasury, led. The Powder Gate was built in place of the older Gate tower. related to the fortification of the Old Town of Prague from the time of Václav II's reign. The older tower was known as the Mountain Gate. The Powder Gate was designed largely as a representative symbol as well as a customs collection point. Its construction began in 1475. From about 1715 it served as a firepowder warehouse, hence the name 'Powder". During the Prussia siege of Prague in 1757, the tower was considerably destroyed. Today's appearance was not acquired by the tower until 1878-1886 for a fresh look treatment, led by architect Josef Mocker. The draft was the Old Town Bridge Tower.

CHRÁM MATKY BOŽÍ PŘED TÝNEM

PRAGUE 1, STAROMĚSTSKÉ NÁMĚSTÍ

Mother of God Church Before Thine (Kostel Matky Boží v před Týnem) is located in the Old Town of Prague, close to Old Town Square. Its construction ran from the mind-14th century to the first decades of the 16th century.

It is among Prague's most artistically important churches, architecturaland its surviving internal mobilizer. Its western front, applying towards the square, is one of Prague's most famous dominants.





STAROMĚSTSKÝ ORLOJ PRAGUE 1. STAROMĚTSKÉ NÁMĚSTÍ

The Old Town Square of the Old Town Orloj (Staroměstský orloj) are medieval astronomical clocks located on the south side of the Old Town Hall tower in Prague.

The first written reference to Orloj dates back to 1410. The clock is made up of several parts - apart froman astronomical and calendar plate, it is fitted with the mechanism of twelve apostles, who appear in two small windows every entire hour (9.00 - 11p.m.). In a parade of apostles, another mannequin on the sides of the clock comes alive in mechanical motion - the reaper ringing, turning the hourglass, indicating to thestanding Turk that his time is up.

He's shaking his head away. Vanity and Lakomec behave similarly. The sought-after Orloj is part of the historic centre of Prague, belonging to the UNESCO list of cultural monuments.

NÁRODNÍ DIVADLO

PRAGUE 1, NÁRODNÍ 1


The National Theatre (Národní divadlo) in Prague is among the best known theatres in the Czech Republic. The symbol of the entire theatre is the novorenaissance building of the Josef Zítka Theatre, which is one of the most important structures in the country both in terms of generally post-culture, historical and purely architectural.

The lavish exterior and interior decoration, which will particullary interest its rich gilding, is made up of the top works of the 19th century Czech authors - M. . Alše, F. Ženíška, V. Hynaise, J. V. Myslbeka etc. A visit to the performances, along with the beautiful theatre spaces, makes for an unforgettable experience. The theatre managament currently includes five scenes - the National Theatre, the Building Theatre. The State Opera New State National theatre is then made up of four art sets – the Opera, the Performance and the Laterna Magika.

BETLÉMSKÁ KAPLE

PRAGUE 1, BETLÉMSKÉ NÁMĚSTÍ

The Bethlehem Chapel (Betlém-ská kaple) located in Prague's Old Town, is a national cultural monument and the first preacher temple in Europe. It was founded in 1391 by Prague towns people Jan Kříž and Hanuš of Muhlheim. It was built in 1391 - 1394 and in 1402 - 1413 Master Jan Hus. From the outset it was associated with the university.





KARLŮV MOST PRAGUE 1. KARLŮV MOST

Charles Bridge (Karlův most) is the second oldest bridge inthe Czech Republic and in Prague the oldest surviving bridge over the River Vltavu. It was created at the site of the original Judith Bridge destroyed in 1342 by the dances of ice. The bridge endedon both sides by the towers founded by Charles IV in 1357. 30 statues of saints adorn the pillars of bridge.

At the site of today's Charles Bridge. in the old days, there used to be a crossing over bound logs (so called sill in the 10 – century period springs here stood a wooden bridge that had been regularly stoked by floods, so he had Vladislav II built around 1170, the stone bridge of Juditin (named after the dynast's wife, Judith Durynské. It was damaged in 1342 when ice melted in the spring. The bridge was decorated with statues and soosers. Originally called only stone or Prague bridge. The name of Charles Bridge was with the coll of 1870 on the base of an earlier undertaking K.H. Borovský.

PRAŽSKÝ HRAD

PRAGUE 1. PRAŽSKÝ HRAD

Prague Castle, which is the traditional seat of Czech monarchs and has also been the seat of the President of the Republic since 1918, the most visited landmark of the Czech Republic. With successive adittions and modifications to Prague Castle, one of the largest castle complexes in the world has been created, with thousands of visitors visiting daily. Prague Castle is open year round and can be seen by Old Royal Palace. permanent exhibition Story of Prague Castle, Basilica of St. George, the Institute of Noble, the Golden Alley with the Daliborka Tower, the Prague Castle Picture Saloon, The Pig Tower and the St. John's Vinevyard. Prague Castle was probably founded as early as round 880 by Prince Bořivoi of the House of Přemyslovců. According to the Guiness Book of Records, Prague castle is the largest continuous castle complex in the world, stretching over nearly 70 000 square metres, and is also listed in the UNESCO World Cultural and Natural Heritage List.



FEEL LIKE IN HOLLYWOOD!



Ithough you won't find any Hollywood movie stars in the Czech streets, many of them were filming here. So you can make a picture of Czech sites that adorn a lot of famous Hollywood movies.

We have to Start with the blockbuster Mission: Impossible from 1996 with Tom Cruise in the lead role. It was the first major Hollywood production that visited Prague and the filmmakers had used a number of gorgeous Prague scenes. The party at the embassy was filmed at the National Museum, the escape from modern glass restaurant (cover photo) on the Old Town Square. In this case, however, keep in mind that the restaurant itself doesn't exist – it was made just for the purpose of filming the movie.

After 15 years the production of Mission: Impossible returned to Prague, this with the fourth chapter – Ghost Protocol. They used the Main Railway Station (the opening scene with killed agent) or the corner house in the street Pstrossova 17, where Ethan Hunt ran from the police. In 2002 Anthony Hopkins and Chris Rock visited Prague together to shoot an action thriller Bad Company. Rock was chased

by bad guys in Thun Street in Lesser Town (Malá Strana), Hopkins' agent went to helim him through Castle stairs (Zámecké schody). Together they went to the Castle Square. They also used the Shooter's Island (Střelecký ostrov) in the Old Town (the scene with atomic bomb dealer).

Even the legendary vampire slayer Blade used the streets of Prague in his second adventure movie. From the entrance next to the pizzeria in the Sokolovská Street, the filmmakers made a vampire blood bank. And for the seat of vampire family Damaskinos they used secluded place of Vaničkova Street.

Prague had a key role in the action movie of Vin Diesel xXx filmed in 2002. Beginning of the movie was shot on the Old Town Square (the producers managed to depopulate it, which was almost an im





possible task), then the camera wandered the Týnská Street, the Powder Gate, the Republic Square and the seat of the Czech philharmonic – Rudolfinum.

In 2004 our country was visited by Wolverine – Hugh Jackman, in those times without his comic book claws, but with his long coat and hat as Van Helsing. The battle in the village with three brides of Dracula (probably the best part of the movie) was filmed at the Kunratice Castle in Prague 4. Then the hero walks the street Na Kampě under the Charles Bridge, where

one of the brides offers him a trade. The magnificent ball of vampires was filmed in the Saint Nicholas Church.

This list of Hollywood hits, which included Prague to its scenes, naturally doesn't end. Furthermore, there were shot movies like The Bourne Identity (street Kampa, street of Political prisoners, the Senovážná square) or A Knight's Tale (Prague Castle, the Charles Bridge). Before the walk in our metropolis we recommend to watch all of these mentioned movies.

If you go to the Bakery during the winter season, you can admire the icy decoration consisting not only of classic icicles, but mainly of icy, 'dwarves" reaching sometimes almost a metrein height.





ilm Legends Museum is a unique project, the likes of which you will not find in Europe. This is a purely Czech project, which presents Hollywood in detail. The museum introduces visitors to collectibles and pop culture.

It focuses primarily on sculptures, action figures and replicas from movies, TV series, but also games. You can find Film Legends already in two locations.

The museum in Poděbrady was opened in March 2016, followed by a second branch in Prague, which opened its doors to the first visitors in February 2018. The Prague museum takes up more than 1000 m² and there are more than 650 exhibits of various scales – from 1:6 to life size.

The range of exhibits is really varied, so everyone can find something they like.

Children can look forward to an extensive Disney collection where they will see characters from famous fairy-tales – for example Frozen, Cars, Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs, Inside Out, and many others. There are also heroes from modern films – Avengers, Justice League, Harry Potter, Pirates of the Caribbean and countless others. Last but not least, the collection also contains rare relics from movie classics such as Predator, Alien, Terminator, Avatar, Lord of the Rings, and more. The featured games include God of War, The Witcher, Mortal Kombat and Batman: Arkham

The layout of the collection is based on the needs of the youngest visitors. The exhibits are therefore separated into two rooms, and there is also a spacious children's corner and silent movie projection, where visitors can relax with movie classics. Each of the exhibits is very detailed and hand-painted, and exists in a very limited amount. In all three branches, over 1700 exhibits can now



















be seen, which makes the museum one of the largest of its kind in the world.

The museum, which is literally a paradise for movie fans of all ages, also hosts weekend programs accompanied by live film characters. Do you want to go there and see everything with your own eyes?

hen you come across this impressive building, you can't help feeling that this is what a real magic

school would look like. But the Apolinar is doing a more meritorious thing for decades it has been helping the people from Prague get to the world.

Neo-Gothic Provincial Maternity Hospital at St. Apolinare made of red gray bricks immediately transfers everyone to old England. The building was designed by the leading Czech architect Josef Hlávka, built between 1867 and 1970. At the time, it was the largest and most modern maternity hospital in Europe.

The building of the modern maternity hospital was created on impulse of Count František Thun-Hohenstein due to very poor hygienic conditions in the existing facilities in Prague. In 1863, the Provincial Committee entrusted the Kingdom of the Czech Builder Josef Hlávek to work out a project to build a new Provincial Maternity Hospital. Finally, he decided for a square plan with an inner rectangular courtyard in the middle, a four-winged core and eleven tracts that

lead to different parts of the hospital and are interconnected by corridors.

The architecturally most interesting part of the building of the Land Maternity Hospital is the Chapel of St. Cross. It is located on the first floor, above the entrance hall. The space of the chapel is formed by a rich star cellar vault, which leads in the central column.

The building under the Church of St. Apolinare is one of the most famous in the republic. It is the original place of alcohol drunk tank. It was the very first drunk tank in the world and became a Czech export article, because it has proven itself good and was established in a similar way to the rest of the world.

here are many attractions and so-called tourist traps near famous Charles Bridge.
And there's also a lot of commotion. Where can one enjoy the beauty of the old city and not have to push and shove through the crowds of curious visitors? Without a doubt in Piknik Park.

The recently opened Piknik Park restaurant is located in the heart of Malá Strana, just a few steps from Charles Bridge and Lennon's Wall, right on the banks of Čertovka. Čertovka in Prague is a place that separates Kampa from the rest of Malá Strana. It is an artificially created water channel that was built back in the twelfth century and still astonishes with its beautiful conception. Piknik Park is situated right at Čertovka, so the view is truly unique.

The interior of the enterprise is above reproach. It is a new, completely renovated place, designed with feeling and is quite intimate. The restaurant and garden holds a few dozen people, which I personally see as a great positive. Large businesses give off a much less personal impression, and one often feels like they are in a factory cafeteria.

The restaurant menu is focused on Italian cuisine. This is a somewhat unusual choi-

ce for the center of Prague. But it makes sense. The pursuit of a typical Czech meal has become the nonsensical mantra of many Prague businesses, and the gastronomy has stagnated in recent years as a result. Not to mention that although Czech cuisine is excellent without debate and has many advantages, at the same time it is very heavy and can't be eaten all the time (in the sense that one likes to have it out of curiosity but then prefers something lighter). The pure Italian cuisine is therefore a breath of fresh air in Prague, and in this case also an authentic one. Piknik Park has two Italian cooks under its thumb, all the dishes are made of high quality and fresh ingredients and always according to the best traditions of Italian cuisine.

Due to the focus on Italian cuisine, it is not surprising that the beverage menu isn't dominated by beer (but of course, it's on tap there). On the contrary, wine plays a primary role, which is delivered by the Vino Hruška winery. A stylish wine shop is part of the restaurant and people can hear the offer there. There is really a large selection, the wines are delicious, and if you would like to have a glass with your meal (or even a few), it would be a big mistake to go over the offer there and not taste anything. Even though Czech wines clearly dominate the offer, there are, of course, also foreign wines.

In spite of its location in the heart of Malá Strana, Piknik Park does not have any excessive prices (which also applies to the wines where a whole bottle is priced in the hundreds of crowns). What, on the contrary, Piknik Park has - and it is a real rarity in these parts - is a year-round garden. Something like that is not common in Prague, and it's a tremendous shame. Of course, it is worth visiting the city even in colder weather, and there is no reason to hide from it. In order for the garden to be a year-round garden, it has thermal heaters.

Once again, Picnic Park is out of the ordinary, it is also thanks to the live music on the terrace (playing every day!). It is usually created by two musicians (such as a violinist and a guitar player) which gives the atmosphere of the place a truly unique touch. It's almost like from a movie - a romantic retreat in a beautiful city, excellent food, a candle on the table, and pleasant, unobtrusive and yet intoxicating background music. There is something magical about it.

It's no problem to go without a reservation to Piknik Park, but if you're preparing to go there in the evening, a reservation won't hurt. Due to its location and excellent gastronomy, it's a place that's very popular not only with tourists but also with Prague residents, despite its short existence.

Of course, it is also possible to rent the whole space for a private event. However, in that case it is good to think ahead and make a reservation in time. In the case of a reception, you do not have to stick to Italian cuisine – the chefs will be happy to hear any of your wishes.

Every city is in a way "hostage" to supply and demand. It demonstrates the trend and, to a great extent, it may stifle originality. Piknik Park goes its own way. It offers a place that is not afraid to be elegant, affordable at the same time, with refreshing cuisine and a location that is popular for its scenic walks. You will certainly not lose out by visiting.


