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[→] WELCOME TO PRAGUE!



Welcome to Prague! Whether you've just landed, arrived by train, bus or car, we've got the allimportant low down on how to reach the city center using all the possible means of transportation, whether on a tight budget or otherwise.

↓ 1. ARRIVING IN PRAGUE BY PLANE

The airport is located on the northwest edge of Prague, some 20km (12 miles) from the city center. Although Prague boasts other, smaller airports, all international flights operate through Ruzyně. Important related phone numbers include +420 220 113 314 (general info), +420 220 116 072 (baggage claim) and +420 220 114 283 (lost & found).

↓ 1. ПРИБЫТИЕ В ПРАГУ НА САМОЛЕТЕ

Аэропорт расположен на северозападной окраине Праги, приблизительно в 20 км от центра города. Хотя Прага может похвастаться другими, меньшими аэропортами, все международные рейсы осуществляются через аэропорт Рузине. Необходимыми телефонными номерами являются +420 220 113 314 (общая информация), +420 220 116 072 (багаж) и +420 220 114 283 (стол находок).

↓ GETTING TO THE CITY CENTRE

If you've just arrived at the airport, getting downtown is generally, depending on the traffic, a matter of some 20 to 30 minutes (if you make use of a taxi or a shuttle service; see below), or 50 minutes if you use the cheaper yet convenient and comfortable public transportation.

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↓...BY PUBLIC

TRANSPORTATION

Bus presents the cheapest way of reaching city center. It links the airport with the terminus of one of Prague's three subway lines. The drawback may be the fact that you need to buy a bus ticket, for which you'll need Czech crowns. Use the ATMs in the arrivals hall to get Czech crowns, rather than changing money at the overpriced exchange offices. You can either buy your ticket from the kiosk or the transport information desk in both arrival halls (open 7AM – 10PM), from the coin vending machines located right at the bus stop platform, or directly from the driver, although this will cost a couple extra crowns. The ticket price is 26 Czech crowns (1EUR / 1.3USD) for a transfer ticket that remains valid for the follow-up subway ride, or for a total of 75 minutes, plus an extra 13 crowns for larger pieces of luggage.

BUS # 119

This will probably be most people's choice as the 119 provides the quickest connection to the historical center. Depending on the time of day, it runs every 7 to 20 minutes and gets you to the A line of Prague's subway. Hop on, remember to validate your ticket, and don't get off until the final stop (Dejvická). The subway entrance is just next to where you get off. The bus runs from 4:18AM until around 12:10 AM at night.

BUS # 100

The 100 bus links the airport with the B-line of the Prague subway. Just get off at Zličín, the final stop. The 100 runs every 15 minutes throughout the day and every half hour after 7PM. The ride takes 15 minutes, but expect another 20 minutes of subway ride if you're aiming

↓... НА ОБЩЕСТВЕННОМ ТРАНСПОРТЕ

Автобус представляет самый дешевый способ как добраться до центра Праги. Он связывает аэропорт с терминалом одной из трех линий пражского метро. Недостатком является то, что вам будут нужны чешские кроны, чтобы купить билет на автобус. Пользуйтесь банкоматами в зале прибытия, чтобы получить чешские кроны, а не менять деньги в обменных пунктах по повышенной цене. Вы можете купить билет в киоске или в информационном бюро в обоих залах прибытия (работает с 7 утра до 10 вечера), из монетных автоматов, расположенных на автобусной остановке, или прямо у водителя, хотя это будет стоить пару дополнительных крон.

Цена билета с пересадкой составляет 26 чешских крон (1EUR / 1.3USD). Он остается в силе для следующей поездки метро - в общей сложности действителен в течение 75 минут. Для багажа больших размеров вы заплатите следующих 13 крон. Обратите внимание на то, что торговые автоматы и шоферы не принимают иностранную валюту. Автобус удобный, чистый и безопасный способ сообщения с центром Праги для тех, кто хочет сэкономить. Однако, автобус может быть довольно переполненным в часе пик!

АВТОБУС № 119

Вероятно, большинство людей выберет автобус № 119, который обеспечивает быструю связь с историческим центром. В зависимости от времени суток, он ездит каждые 7 - 20 минут и соединяет пассажиров с линией пражского метро. Садитесь на автобус и не забудьте закомпостировать свой билет. Поезжайте до конечной станции метро Дејвицка. Вход в метро находится

to reach the city center afterwards by metro. The bus runs from 5:30AM until around 11:50 PM.

AIRPORT EXPRESS BUS

The Airport Express bus service links the airport with the Hlavní nadrazi train station; it runs every half hour and the ride takes 40 minutes. Although part of Prague's public transportation system, special fares apply: tickets can be purchased solely from the driver and run for 50 crowns (with no extra luggage fees). The AE runs from from 5:00AM to 10:00PM.

TRAVELLING AT NIGHT

If you want to use the public transportation at night, look out for the # 510 bus, operating between midnight and 3.30AM and linking the airport with the tram at Divoka Sarka. From there, take the tram # 51 to the city center. Note that the night bus runs every 30 minutes.

↓ ...BY SHUTTLE

Various companies run shuttle door-to-door services, or drop you off at the city center. They are generally priced lower compared to taxis, and can be easily found outside the terminals. The CEDAZ minibus shuttles run every half hour and costs 120 crowns per person, dropping you off at the city center. The service operates between 5:30AM and 9:30PM. CEDAZ will also drive you directly to any given address, but you need to pre-book (call +420 211 111 111 or go to www.cedaz.cz). Other shuttle services include Prague Airport Transfers who accept credit cards (www.prague-airport-transfers.com).

АВТОБУС № 100

Автобус № 100 соединяет аэропорт с линией Б пражского метро. Выйдите на конечной остановке Зличин. Автобус № 100 ходит каждые 15 минут в течение дня и каждые полчаса после 7 часов вечера. Поездка продолжается 15 минут, но вас ждет еще 20 минут езды на метро, если вы на нем собираетесь добираться до центра города. Автобус курсирует с 5ч. 30мин. утра примерно до 23ч.50мин. ночи.

АВТОБУС AIRPORT EXPRESS

Автобус Airport Express (AE) связывает аэропорт с Главным вокзалом (Hlavní nadrazi). Он ездит каждые полчаса, и поездка длится 40 минут. Хотя AE является частью системы общественного транспорта Праги, здесь применяются специальные тарифы: билеты можно приобрести только у водителя и в цене 50 крон (без дополнительной оплаты за багаж). AE ездит с 5ч. утра до 10ч. вечера.

НОЧНЫЕ РЕЙСЫ

Если вы хотите использовать общественный транспорт в ночное время, обратите внимание на автобус № 510, который ездит между полночью и 3ч. 30мин. утра и связывает аэропорт с трамваем на остановке Дивока Шарка (Divoka Sarka). Оттуда добирайтесь на трамвае № 51 до центра города. Обратите внимание - ночной автобус ходит каждые 30 минут.

↓ ...НА МАРШРУТНОМ ТАКСИ

Различные компании используют челночное сообщение „от двери до двери „ или высаживают вас в центре города. Их цены, как правило, ниже, чем в такси, и такой тип такси можно легко найти за пределами терминалов. Челночные микроавтобусы CEDAZ ходят каждые полчаса, и проезд в центр города стоит 120 крон на человека. Микроавтобус курсирует с 5ч.30мин. утра до 9ч.30мин. вечера. CEDAZ вас также отвезет по любому заранее

↓...BY TAXI

Prague taxi drivers are notorious for overcharging tourists. Generally, you should be on the safe side with the fleet of AAA-labelled taxis waiting in front of the terminal. The ride will cost around 500 – 700 crowns. Don't shy away from contacting a competing company, but make sure to always check the price beforehand, whatever company you've chosen! You shouldn't ever have to pay over 900 crowns.

↓... НА ТАКСИ

Пражские таксисты известны своим обчитыванием туристов. Поэтому на всякий случай пользуйтесь такси с надписью AAA, ожидающих перед терминалом. Поездка будет стоить около 500 - 700 крон. Не бойтесь воспользоваться услугами конкурирующих компаний, но заранее убедитесь в цене. Независимо от компании, которую вы выбрали, вы никогда не должны платить более 900 крон.



↓2. ARRIVING IN PRAGUE BY TRAIN

International trains arrive at the central station, Hlavní nádraží, often referred to as Praha hl.n. The station is directly connected with Prague's subway system and located right in the city centre. If arriving after dark, we highly recommend hopping on the subway (remember to buy a ticket) rather than walking out and through the surrounding park. Most of the station itself has just been refurbished and boasts a modern look with plenty of kiosks, drug stores and fast-food joints.

↓2. ПРИЕЗД В ПРАГУ НА ПОЕЗДЕ

Международные поезда прибывают на центральную станцию, Hlavní nádraží, часто называемую Praha hl.n. Станция непосредственно связана с пражским метро и расположена в самом центре города. Если вы прибываете после наступления темноты, мы настоятельно рекомендуем вам ехать на метро (не забудьте купить билет) и не проходить через окружающий парк. Большая часть самой станции только что была отремонтирована и может похвастаться современным видом с множеством киосков, аптек и ресторанов быстрого питания.

3. ARRIVING IN PRAGUE BY BUS

Florenc is the central bus station; located in the city centre, it is also directly adjacent to Prague subway's station Florenc (a transfer station between the lines C and B). Like the central train station, Florenc has recently undergone a major facelift and now boasts a pleasant and clean arrivals & departures hall with kiosks and fast-foods (Burger King, anyone?), and most importantly a big screen showing the bus times and the respective platforms.

3. Приезд в Прагу на автобусе

Флоренц не только является центральной автобусной станцией, расположенной в центре города, но и в непосредственной близости от пражской станции метро Флоренц (переход между линиями С и В). Как и центральный железнодорожный вокзал, станция Флоренц недавно подверглась значительной реконструкции и теперь может похвастаться приятным и чистым залом приездов и отъездов с киосками и ресторанами фаст-фуд (желаете Burger King?), а самое главное - большим экраном с отъездами и приездами автобусов и с указанием соответствующих платформ.



4. ARRIVING IN PRAGUE BY CAR

Prague falls victim to traffic jams and a lack of legal parking spaces (streets with blue-marked areas on the side are reserved for residents and you run the risk of having your car towed if you park there). This is why we recommend using the so-called P+R's (park and ride) parking places, situated near all highways. Find more info at www.dpp.cz/en/parking.

4. Приезд в Прагу на автомобиле

Прага становится жертвой пробок и недостатком законных парковочных мест. Улицы с полосой синего цвета на стороне означают области зарезервированные для жителей. В этом случае вы рискуете, что ваш автомобиль будет отбуксирован при паркинге. Именно поэтому мы рекомендуем использовать так называемые стоянки парк анд райд (P + R) - парковочные места, расположенные вблизи всех магистралей. Более подробную информацию найдете на www.dpp.cz/en/parking.

PRAGUE'S PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM

Prague's public transportation system is generally reasonably clean, very efficient, runs on time, and its network spans the whole city; with the price of 32 CZK for a transfer ticket (1EUR / 1.3USD), it cannot be beat. If you don't need to venture out of the center, you can confine to using the subway (or metro, as it's called here) and trams; buses service the further-away neighbourhoods. Let's look more closely at the various tickets you can purchase.

Tickets can be bought from the numerous vending machines in all the metro stations and at many tram stops (always keep coins at hand), or from most tobacco stores / kiosks.

24-hour pass: 110 CZK

3-day pass: (72 hours): 310 CZK

ONE-OFF TICKETS

30 min. / 5 stops / no transfer ticket: 24 CZK, 90 min. transfer ticket: 32 CZK

Remember to validate your ticket upon first entering the metro / boarding a tram or bus. (i.e. slip the ticket into one of the yellow boxes and wait for the info to be stamped on it).

СИСТЕМА ОБЩЕСТВЕННОГО ТРАНСПОРТА В ПРАГЕ

Общественный транспорт в Праге, как правило, достаточно чистый, очень эффективный и точный. Его сеть охватывает весь город. Цена билета 32 крон за поездку с пересадкой (1EUR / 1.3USD) очень выгодна. Если вам не надо выходить из центра, вы можете ограничиться метро и трамваями. Автобусы следуют в окрестности города. Давайте более внимательно рассмотрим различные типы билетов, которые можно приобрести. Билеты можно приобрести в многочисленных торговых автоматах на всех станциях метро и на многих трамвайных остановках (всегда имейте при себе монеты), или в большинстве табачных магазинов или киосков.

Суточный билет (24 часа): 110 крон

Трёхдневный билет(72 часа): 310 крон

РАЗОВЫЕ БИЛЕТЫ

30 минут / 5 остановок / без пересадки: 24 крон

90 минут /с пересадкой: 32 крон

Не забудьте закопостировать свой билет при первом входе в метро, в трамвай или в автобус. (т.е. вложите билет в одну из желтых коробок и подождите пока билет не будет закопостирован). 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FACTS & INFO

For over 1000 years, Prague has served as the political, cultural and economic centre of the Czech state. Having been the seat of two Holy Roman Emperors during the gothic and renaissance periods, it also had the status of the Holy Roman Empire capital. Prague's history commenced in the year 870, although evidence shows the area had been inhabited since the Stone Age. The city flourished during the 14th century, under the reign of King Charles IV, who, among other deeds, ordered the building of the famous Charles Bridge or Saint Vitus Cathedral, the oldest gothic cathedral in central Europe, and Charles University, the oldest university in central Europe. Prague was then the third-largest city in Europe. Now home to some 1.2 million inhabitants, Prague became the capital of the newly set up Czechoslovakia in 1918, with the end of WW I and the dissolution of the Austro-Hungarian Empire. In 1992, Prague's historic center became a UNESCO world heritage site, and is currently one of the world's most popular tourist destinations.

На протяжении более 1000 лет, Прага служит политическим, культурным и экономическим центром чешского государства. Она была пристольным городом двух императоров Священной Римской империи в готическом периоде и в эпохе Возрождения. Прага также имела статус столицы Священной Римской империи. История Праги началась в 870г., хотя есть сведения о том, что область была населена с периода каменного века. Город процветал в течение 14-го века, во времена правления короля Карла IV, который, наряду с другими проектами, приказал построить знаменитый Карлов мост, кафедральный готический собор Святого Вита, и Карлов университет - старейшие постройки в Центральной Европе. В то время Прага была третьим по величине городом Европы. Сейчас здесь проживает около 1,2 млн. человек. После окончания Первой мировой войны и распада Австро-Венгерской империи в 1918 году Прага стала столицей вновь созданной Чехословакии. В 1992 году исторический центр Праги стал принадлежать к Всемирному наследию ЮНЕСКО, и в настоящее время является одним из самых популярных туристических мест в мире.

The current artistic practice in London is quite diverse with no dominant school or group that would be easy to classify or designate. The exhibition includes representatives of the emerging generation of young and recognized old authors, which is good because of the diversity.

Before you write your angry letters to Hollywood, it's good to know that this new vision is worth to have your attention and his relationship to the previous trilogy of Spidey similar to Nolan's Batman to the original Batman series. This means that artists play a realistic string and you can forget a "dear neighbor Spiderman". This guy is since the disappearance of his parents in big troubles and when he finally gets the abilities, he will spoil it as much as save. There is a bonus of the perfect 3D.

The successful project of the AMoYA museum starts off the exhibition year of 2012, bearing the symbolic name "Second Season." In fact, it consists of several expository projects that are linked together by the unique environment of the baroque palace Colloredo – Mansfeld. Ivan Kafka's work "Nowhere to nowhere" is a positively original one. It was used to represent us at the most prestigious exhibition of contemporary art, the 1997 Biennale in Venice. The installation consists of 1,000 of arrows; a half of them face to the right, the other 500 to the left.

Artbanka Museum of Young Art (AMoYA) has recently established a partnership with 13 first-rate curators from 7 different Academies of Fine Arts from the Czech Republic and Slovakia; each of them introduces their Academy's vision of young art, as well as their own. The result, therefore, is literally a duel of Academies and curators; such duel confronts the young artists with the same generation that's currently graduating other Academies.

All of the AMoYA exhibitions can be found on the 4,000 squared metres of the Colloredo-Mansfeld palace.

For this summer, the Gallery La Femme has prepared an exhibition called Summer Mix, at which it will present works of renowned Czech artists. You will have a chance to see the works of Eva Mansfeldová, Milan Chabera, Miroslav Jiránek, Boris Jirků, Tomáš Hřivnáč, Roman Bričcín, Michael Rittstein, Adolf Born, Jan Šafránek, Jan Koblasa, Jan Hladík, Zdeněk Tománek, Bára Olmrová and others. The Gallery La Femme was launched in 2000 and is located in Bílkova street in the Old Town. Its main theme is woman as the eternal source of artistic inspiration – you can see her here in endless variations, sizes and colours. Woman is the inspiration here and the visitor can see how she is seen by the artists. The gallery also organises interesting projects, some of which are for example regular homework assignments as well as international symposia. For Homework assignments, the gallerist Miroslav Lipi-

na addresses about sixty Czech artists, who then create a painting on a common topic, such last being From the Stage. This one was preceded by topics such as Venus, Woman and Car, Mona Lisa, Women, Wine and Song, The Young Ladies of Avignon, Woman Entrapped in Technology, Woman and Architecture, or Luncheon on the Grass.

Most interesting are also trips abroad, where the gallery travels together with chosen artists. On those trips originate paintings and sculptures which are not created on a given topic but are, by contrast, influenced by the new environment in which the artists worked together. So far, there have been trips to Brazil, Ecuador, Canada, Spain, and France as well as to the Czech Republic. This year the Gallery La Femme is planning a trip to Brittany, France, and the symposium will bear the name Brittany – The Lady of Two Faces.

The paintings both from the artistic trips and Homework assignments will be on display at the summer exhibition at the Gallery La Femme until the end of August. In September you will have a chance to see an exhibition of the paintings by Ladislav Maria Wagner. Come and see.

RETRO: ALIEN

- WHAT COULD BE BUT IT'S NOT

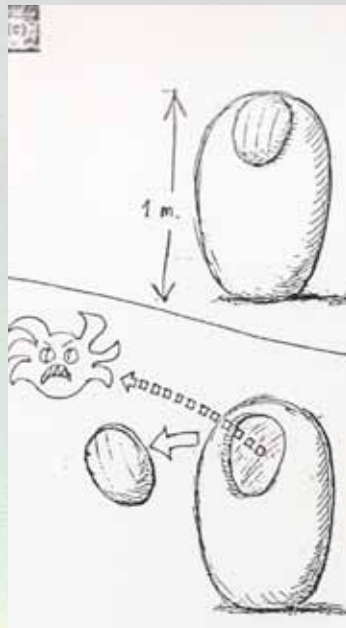
The classic movie *Alien* of Ridley Scott is well known and you can actually go to the cinema to *Prometheus*, which shows how it all began. But one step and it would be different, completely different.

When was screenwriter Dan O'Bannon playing with the scenario of the fear on the spaceship, he had just a very little idea of what will dispose the crew. His graphic sketches (picture below) were much more distant from what should scare mentally healthy people to death and it's hard to say if it would become classic. But then H.R. Giger came on-board – an ingenious pervert. It is only because of him that the alien killer with acid got so pretty perverted and frightening appearance.

Ridley Scott originally wanted the alien to be transparent which is interesting that the creators used this feature to create *Alien's* longtime enemy *Predator*. Scott dropped the idea and considered that the alien should have at least transparent head where you could see the brain. Even (fortunately?) it was denied.

Sigourney Weaver almost lost the role during the first filming day. She was with a cat Jones on a scene but then she got very ugly skin rash. Staff considered that it could be allergy to cats and then wanted to fire her. But it turned out that her skin only reacted to the spray make your skin look sweaty.

We could have also seen tougher and spicy scenes. In the original scenario was an erotic scene between Dallas



and Ripley, at the end Weaver should show completely naked to express her fragility and during the waking up from hyper-sleep Cartwright and Weaver should have exposed nipples. But all this would make the distribution more difficult. And what was the biggest loss? Scott originally wanted a much harsher end – Alien would bite Ripley's head and leave a message to Earth with her voice.

Studio disagreed with the final version which is perhaps a pity; because *Alien* would be more peppery but might eventually end much worse.

Let's be grateful for classic.

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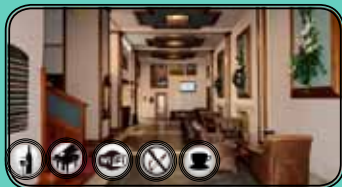
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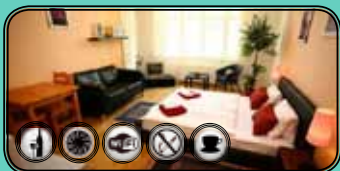
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Czech Beer – gold that we must protect

Czech nation is not one of the largest, but we don't get lost in the world. We speak regularly to international hockey competitions, here and there we sparkle in another sport, and we have women so beautiful that even Photoshop is useless, and of course, there is Czech beer. This is our best-known brand.

The history of beer is very rich and although we would like to give the first notch to Czech, we have to go much further to search the roots. The beginnings of the phenomenon are slightly

unclear, partly because no one saw the phenomenon in beer that time and historians did not pay as much attention as it would be advisable. The probable cradle of ancient beer seems to be Mesopotamia where the Sumerians and Assyrians cultivated various grains including barley in seventh millennium BC. The drink was discovered like the other great discoveries – by the coincidence. It is assumed that the production was discovered after finding that the container in which was powdered grain and water. A pleasant drink with a slightly narcotic effect was made. The first records about beer come from Babylon round 3000 BC.

In this country our own beer for enjoyed by the Celts, hopping beer itself,

however, is attributed to the Slavs. The oldest written evidence of beer for us is the foundation charter of King Vratislav II from 1088 to the church of Vyšehrad. The king assigned them a tithe from hop. Brewing in the early middle age wasn't just the prerogative of the monasteries, but also of the cities where every citizen was absolutely right to brew his own beer. There was only necessary to obtain permission from the king and you could create a personal cellar version of this golden delight. Even then the competition was functioning naturally. While today, you need to protect your brand 10 lawyers in one paragraph and special container license, in those times they applied laws banning to import foreign beer to town in the radius of 10 kilometers. Originally, each person was producing his own beer. But they gradually moved from the basements of the houses to independent breweries. At the end of the 15th century happened, what had to happen. The nobility finally realized that

beer has economic potential and the fights started. The treaty of St. Wenceslas in 1517 of Louis Jagiello lay down rules for the production and its consequences will be extended until 1869. By this time, most of the nobles enthusiastically earned money from the brewing.

The change came with technological advances, not surprisingly, accurately with change of brewing technology by Bavarian pattern. It was the twilight hours of brewing by the traditional craft, which perfected the famous Czech brewer František Ondřej Poupě (1753-1805), which many see as a genius (among other things, he is famous because of designing beer weight). Beer production became more industrial and technically complicated. At the end of the 18th century were the main ingredients barley and Czech hops. Breakthrough came in 1842, when the opening of the Burgeß Brewery in Pilsen (picture of the building below). In that brewery, Bava-

rian brewer Groll created a prototype of today's lager, which became the dominant type not only here, but later in the rest of the world. Czech hops and malt became a sought-after export goods. The popularity of Czech beer gaining momentum and drink very quickly gained fame around the world. Perhaps it would dominate the global market, but the two world wars stopped the development of the Czech brewing. Paradoxically, the Czech beer has its unique flavor that provides fans from all corners of

the world because of this stopped development. Combining the expertise of Czech brewers with restrictions, which sprung from the early 20th problematic century (including the unavailability of investment to modernize equipment breweries), resulted in that the taste of Czech beer today

is somewhat different from what the „cog“ in foreign countries. Czech Beer is much more fragrant and drinkable than foreign beers and it also has a darker color. The fundamental difference

from other beers is also the presence of unfermented extract of saccharide components that add fullness and with CO2 saturation offers a taste for another sip. Czechs are proud of their beer. As a result, no foreign brand in this country does as well as domestic one. Recently, while Czech producers began experimenting with flavored variants that have with real beer common as much as meat and sausages, it is nevertheless a mere concession to the times in which younger drinkers don't like the bitter taste of



unique amber nectar. However, the time will eventually come. Czech beer has been and always be the best of its kind. After all, there is no coincidence that it's protected by the geographical indication of the European Union, whose purpose is to preserve the reputation and quality of beer brewed in the Czech

Republic. No one will mess with us. Our liquid gold have been perfected.

Van Vu Manh: Sushi Master of Vietnam

How do you get to what you do?

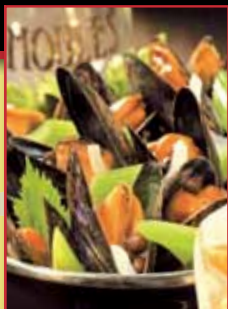

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WHEN CZECH MAN INVITES YOU TO ONE BEER...

It sounds quite innocent. "Come on; let's go just for one beer. You will be at home in 30 minutes. Do not be fooled. Not by coincidence is said that Czech people are first league drinkers. If there is something we do, we do it properly.

Every city has its own style and rhythm. It's always clever to know something about the specific location in advance to eliminate unpleasant surprises. What will be described now in the framework (not only) of Prague nightlife is nothing, what one should be ashamed of, or what would be necessary to avoid. It's just good to know what you are willing to go to or risk. (as you should know the risk in

fatally dangerous operations).

Let's outline a traditional Czech situation, which you will encounter on 100% after some time (if you befriend someone local). At some point, quite inevitably, there will be a question: "Let's go to one?" Questioning person means a completely innocent affair at the first sight. Translated, this means: Can we go on one beer? The word "one" is the key. It's a tricky trap. There will be one beer. After one, however, there are always more beers following. Expecting just one beer is just as naïve as expecting just one medical examination after the night spent in Bangkok night club. There are situations which are not without plural number.

So how does it work in practice? At the beginning you will actually get a beer. Half a liter of inexpensive entertainment, which theoretically should last a few hours. But the masters of good hop invented it very good and after the first half hour you are staring into the empty

glass and considering next steps. Fortunately, the Czechs do not suffer from similar defects so before you can say "hangover", there will be another beer on your table. And not necessarily ordered by your mate. The service in the Czech companies is well trained that they are serving beers like on a conveyor belt. Besides, the chances to meet someone that doesn't want more beer are always smaller.

Imagine that our "small meeting" started sometime after eight o'clock. At ten o'clock you have had already five beers and started to wonder, where the empty glasses of shots came from. And how many of them did you actually have?! Your Czech companions still look quite soberly, leading to a twofold question: They either lasts more than you, or they want you to get drunk. Both will be true (the second truth is greatly enhancing if you are an attractive blonde). Of course, the purpose is not to make you a drunken donkey, who will be ashamed in the morning. This is not the case. The idea is to have fun and not be afraid of a little diversion. Whether the liver is something we have.

Around half past one in the morning you start to think in what bar you are, how you got here and how many places you have been to. We recommend watching the traces after stamps on your hands or searching the pockets. There could be accounts that tell something. Also, it pays to have comfortable shoes, because at night is minimal chance that you will not end up somewhere on the dance floor (there is higher probability that twins with newly enlarged breasts will want a threesome with you).

Mornings are difficult, since one usually doesn't know where he is. A smartphone with GPS is therefore a clear advantage. As someone who recently woke up after the "Prague little meeting" in Pardubice know what I mean.

So what's the lesson? Something like "go on one" in the Czech Republic doesn't exist in any case. It's a slang expression for 1) toast at the pub, or 2) party to the morning. Count on it and enjoy it!
